



Do you know how to compare using adjectives in English? Have a go!

**i** **Comparison with -er/-est** (for adjectives with one syllable and for adjectives with two syllables and the ending -y, -le, -ow, -er)

For example:

happy – happier – happiest

clean – cleaner – cleanest

narrow – narrower – narrowest

**i** **Comparison with more and most** (adjectives with two syllables – except the ones mentioned above – and more syllables)

For example:

difficult – more difficult – most difficult

**i** **Irregular adjectives**

good – better – best

bad – worse – worst

much – more – most

many – more – most

little – less – least

little – smaller – smallest

**i** If you want to express equality you can use **as** + adjective + **as**: I am **as** old **as** you.

If you want to express inequality you use the **comparative** + than: I am **older** than my friend.

Lucy is **more excited** than her sister.

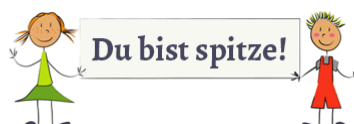
