Comparison wit	h -er/-est (for adjectives with one syllable and for adjectives with two syllables and the ending -y,
-le, -ow, -er)	
For example:	
happy – happier – h	
clean - cleaner - cle	eanest
narrow – narrower –	narrowest
Comparison wit	h more and most (adjectives with two syllables – except the ones mentioned above – and more
syllables)	
For example:	
difficult – more diffic	ult – most difficult

good - better - best

little – less – least

If you want to exp	oress <u>equality</u> you can use as + adjective + as : I am as old as you.
