



Let's practise using comparisons in English!

i Comparison with -er/-est (for adjectives with one syllable and for adjectives with two syllables and the ending -y, -le, -ow, -er)

For example:

happy – happier – happiest

clean – cleaner – cleanest

narrow – narrower – narrowest

i Comparison with more and most (adjectives with two syllables – except the ones mentioned above – and more syllables)

For example:

difficult – more difficult – most difficult

i Irregular adjectives

good – better – best

bad – worse – worst

much – more – most

many – more – most

little – less – least

little – smaller – smallest

i If you want to express equality you can use **as** + adjective + **as**: I am **as** old **as** you.

If you want to express inequality you use the **comparative** + than: I am **older** than my friend.

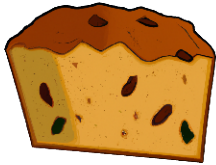
