i Relative pronouns are used to either join two sentences together or to relate them to each other. For example: The famous singer who performs tonight is my sister. OR Who is your sister? Here the "who" relates to the noun in the previous sentence. The relative pronouns are:

- Who - used for people (subject)
- Whom - used for people (object)
- Which - used for objects
- Whose - used to show possession
- Where - refers to places
- When - refers to time
- Why - refers to a reason
- What - refers to things
- That - refers to people, animals and things
